Existing Rule:

230.8b

The referee will be a minimum of 1 year of age above the maximum eligible playing age of the age group to be officiated.

Rule w/ proposed change:

230.8b

The referee will be a minimum of 1 year of age above the maximum eligible playing age of the age group to be officiated with the exception of the 18U and 19U age groups, where an 18 year old referee may referee those ages.

How the Rule would read after proposed change:

230.8b

The referee will be a minimum of 1 year of age above the maximum eligible playing age of the age group to be officiated with the exception of the 18U and 19U age groups, where an 18 year old referee may referee those ages.

Rationale:

An 18 year old referee has to go through background checks and extra training, just like the older referees. As such, an 18 year old referee is considered an adult and is also eligible to do adult games. An 18 year old referee should be allowed to referee any youth game like any other adult referee.

I have searched the policies of both US Soccer and US Youth Soccer. Our current requirement was not found.
