Existing Bylaw: Each applicant for GSSA membership shall submit an initial or annual application on a form approved by the board, accompanied by the appropriate fees and any required supporting documentation. Any application received that is incomplete or lacks the required information shall be returned to the applicant with notice of deficiencies.

Bylaw w/ proposed change: Each applicant for GSSA membership shall submit an initial ~~or annual~~ application on a form approved by the board, accompanied by the appropriate fees and any required supporting documentation. Any affiliate approved for the seasonal year need only submit the appropriate fees to continue their affiliation with GSSA. Any application received that is incomplete or lacks the required information shall be returned to the applicant with notice of deficiencies.

How the Bylaw would read after proposed change: Each new applicant for GSSA Membership shall submit an initial application on a form approved by the board accompanied by the appropriate fees and any supporting documentation. Any affiliate approved for the seasonal year need only submit the appropriate fees to continue their affiliation with GSSA. Any application received that is incomplete or lacks the required information shall be returned to the applicant with notice of deficiencies.

Rationale: An affiliate who receives a bill and does not have to complete the application process will lead to retention of affiliates, save time as billing could be streamlined.
